Objectives:

1. To make other children learn about environmental issues
2. To personally understand more about environmental issues like climate change, air and water pollution and recycling.
3. To learn more about carbon footprints, sustainable lifestyle and share it with others.
4. To recognize adults and children and/or their group who are doing something about protecting the environment.
5. To conduct motivational campaign for the organization of FSLF chapters in various campuses/local communities

Activities:

1. Media Activities – write and talk about environment problems and issues so that other children will learn about them; and to have a show for children that will be hosted by children
2. FSLF Kids Pride Award – we will recognize children and adults or their groups who are doing something good for the environment
3. Conduct or Participate in Eco-camps – learn more about the environment through participation in eco-camps; and share about what we are doing in our own local community to protect the environment
4. Conduct Tree planting – help organize and participate in tree planting events (using native, indigenous, non-invasive tree species). We will also encourage others to plant a tree on their birthday.
5. Conduct Lake Clean-up –pick up litter around the lakeshore area on weekends to set a good example to others
6. Conduct simple water testing
7. Branch off to other schools or local communities

Time Frame:

To complete these projects within two years.
(June 2008 – June 2010)

Expected Outputs:

1. Publish two children's articles in local newspapers every quarter
2. Get invited to talk shows on radio or television
3. To produce a show for children that is hosted by children
4. Plant at least 50 trees in four treeplanting events (using native, indigenous, non-invasive tree species)
5. Birthday Trees Exhibit in school to encourage others to plant a tree on their birthday.
6. Spend at least 200 hours in lake clean-up activities
7. Find out information about our lakes
8. Find and reward individuals and/or groups in San Pablo City to whom we can give the FSLF Kids/Youth Pride Award. There will be two categories: adults and children. FSLF/FSLF Kids/FSLF Youth will not be considered for these awards.

9. Many more children in our city and in our country will learn about the need to protect our environment.

Resources Needed:

1. Writing and art materials for articles and letters and exhibits
2. Funds/Money to produce a show
3. At least 200 native, indigenous, non-invasive seedlings
4. Funds/Money to make and buy some water testing materials
5. FSLF Kids/Youth Pride Award Certificate
6. UNEP materials on the environment eg. OZZY OZONE
